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E. & J. Gallo Winery Expands Its Napa Valley Holdings *Demand for Louis M. Martini and Ghost Pines Brands Drives Vineyard Purchase*

ST. HELENA, Calif. (June 4, 2007) – The E. & J. Gallo Winery, California's largest family-owned winery, announced today that it has purchased 182 acres of Chiles Valley vineyards from the California Wine Company.

This marks a second expansion of Gallo's interest in Napa Valley. In 2002, Gallo purchased the historic Louis M. Martini Winery in St. Helena which included the 150-acre Ghost Pines vineyard in Chiles Valley. Gallo's Chiles Valley vineyards are planted primarily in Cabernet Sauvignon and other red Bordeaux varieties and are located high up in the mountains at an elevation between 900 – 1,400 feet. This latest vineyard acquisition will help Gallo to meet the continued growth of their Louis M. Martini and Ghost Pines brands.
